"Nothing can be more precise than the terms  
used by Brookes. and it wd appear from this  
that it was customary to import from Ireland  
wolf dogs for the purpose of hunting the  
wolves in this part of the Pyrenees.  
They are used by sportsmen for hunting that  
animal the Irish wolf dog - being known in  
Spain by the term "le huel" - possibly by reason  
of his little form & likeness in shape to the  
Gryhound proper.

"Taking for granted that there was an  
importation of T. W. dogs in Spain during  
the 14<sup>th</sup> & Commencement of 18<sup>th</sup> Centuries  
it wd be reasonable to assume that the  
desc of these dogs may still survive in  
Biscay or other parts of the Pyrenees -  
since wolves exist there - Swines are herded  
as of yore and the climate of this mountainous  
district wd not materially tend to the  
degeneration of the race.
